Primary Session

Luke 21:5-19

Opening Life Reflection

The theme for today is Justice. To begin, invite the children to imagine that they are asked by their city or town to design a billboard for the highway with a message of peace. Provide each child with a blank sheet of paper and crayons or markers. Invite the children to create their billboard message of peace with the paper provided. Discuss.

- How can messages of peace on billboards help to make the world a better place?
- How can you be a peacemaker at home?
- How can you be a peacemaker at school?
- How can you be a peacemaker with friends?

Allow time for discussion. God wants all people to be treated fairly and with respect. Peacemakers work for justice and stand up for the rights of others.

Read Luke 21:5-19.

Allow for silence.

- How does Jesus comfort his listeners?
- Why will Jesus protect his followers?

Scripture Background



Provide 2-3 minutes of background information on the Gospel.

In today's Gospel Jesus tells of the frightening events that will happen in the end times. He tells his followers that in the final days, wars, earthquakes, famines and plagues will take place on earth. Jesus wants his followers to remain faithful in times of trouble.

Jesus offers his followers comfort and hope. In times of hardship believers are given the chance to stand up for their faith. The faithful have reason to trust in Jesus who will protect them. Even in the face of death Jesus promises that "not a hair of your head will be harmed."

- Why does Jesus promise to protect his followers?
 - How do you show your faith in Jesus?
 - How does Jesus protect you?
